Last Chance

★ Coco Fusco (closes on Saturday) This engrossing show is the New York debut of Coco Fusco's 2015 film "La Confesión," about the public admission of counterrevolutionary activity made in 1971 in Cuba by the poet Heberto Padilla, after he had spent weeks in prison. His "confession" provided the pretext for a campaign of widespread literary censorship, documented here in a display of government memos recently found by the historian Lillian Guerra in the archives of the Cuban Ministry of Culture. The show includes seven more of Ms. Fusco's films, including one on the dissident poet María Elena Cruz Valera. The longer you spend with Ms. Fusco's work, the deeper it gets.
